

## Anachronists Book Review:

### Lady Eve of Lynn

I had to depend on my local friendly librarian to gather books for me this last few of months, to make things a little easier for her I decided take a big gulp, and tackle as many of Dorothy Dunnets books as they could find for me. I finished the *House of Niccolo* Series I had started in August and finished the series the end of October.

It was quite an undertaking as the action takes place all over the Known World of the mid 15th century. I found myself awash in the many languages that are sprinkled throughout the eight books in the series. Many odd words are used without any translation. I was able to work out most of the meanings .

The eight books in the series are *Niccolo Rising* published in 1992 followed by *Spring of the Ram*; *Race of Scorpions*; *Scales of Gold* ;*The Unicorn Hunt*; *To Lie With Lions*; *Caprice and Rondo*, Last but not least, *Gemini* published in 2000 brings the series to its conclusion.

When I was able to look through the stacks once again by myself, I came across a book by Alexander Dumas that I had somehow missed: *Queen Margot* First published in the U.S. in 1994 I had read his other well known works in High School and given my eldest son *The Three Musketeers* for Christmas the year he was in 8th grade, and his brothers the following years received in turn *The Count of Monte Cristo* and *The Man in the Iron Mask*.

Is Christmas period?

Christmas has celebrated the birth of Jesus on December 25<sup>th</sup> since 354, but the earliest English reference is in 1043. Since ancient times there have been mid winter celebrations throughout the world. In Rome, Saturnalia, honoring Saturn, the god of agriculture, began the week before solstice and lasted an entire month. It was time when food and drink was plentiful and the normal social order was turned upside down. Peasants were in command of the city and slaves became masters. Business and schools were closed so everyone could participate.



In Scandinavia, the Norse celebrated Yule from December 21 through January. This was the celebration of the return of the sun. Large logs would be brought home and set afire. People would feast until the logs burned out. In most of Europe there were festivities at the end of December. It was a time where there was little farm work to do, and the cattle were slaughtered so they would not need to be fed over winter. This meant it was one of the few times there was a supply of fresh meat. It was also a time when the wine and beer that had been prepared earlier were fermented and ready to drink.

It is commonly believed Christianity set December 25<sup>th</sup> as the birth of Christ to adopt and absorb the earlier pagan holidays. Originally called the feast of the Nativity, it had spread to England by the end of the 6<sup>th</sup> century. By the end of the 8<sup>th</sup> century it had reached Scandinavia. While the actual birthday of Jesus is not known, December 25<sup>th</sup> is the most widely celebrated festival the world over.

By the middle ages, the Christmas season became a time for the upper class to repay real or imagined debts to society by entertaining less fortunate citizens. Many of the traditions we uphold today began in the late middle ages. Gift giving, caroling, and feasts became an important part of the celebration.

If you look at the SCA calendar, you will see several 12<sup>th</sup> night events. 12<sup>th</sup> night marks the end of the Christmas festivities. The twelve days of Christmas begins on Christmas day and ends twelve days later on Epiphany, Jan 6<sup>th</sup>. This celebrates when the three kings came to the birthplace of Christ. It was a part of the year end festivities in Britain and France. In the middle ages, 12<sup>th</sup> night was more popular and festive than Christmas. The tradition of gifts given lives on today.

No matter when or where your persona is, there was some sort of end of year celebration. So have a merry Christmas season, no matter how you celebrate it!
